Qualifications and Requirements to test:

- Minimum 18 Years Old
- High School Diploma or GED Equivalent
- Valid State Driver's License
- Arizona Firefighter 1 & 2 or Equivalent.
- Valid Arizona State / National Registry EMT or Paramedic Certification
- NWCG Firefighter Type 2 (or obtain within 1 year)
- National Testing Network (NTN)
- CPAT Certification

Selection Process:

- Submit application and resume by established deadline
- Submit certification of "Qualifications and Requirements" listed above
- CPAT certification within previous 12 months
- Successful completion of National Testing Network (NTN) FireTeam entry level test
- Veterans preference points
- Pass a Drug Screening
- Complete Background check
- Proof of Vaccinations
- Pass a Fitness for Duty Physical
